

# **JEWISH AGENCY** SEEKS U.S. AID

Wants Pressure on Arabs Against Uprisings.

Officials of the Jewish Agency for Palestine were reported to-day to be seeking means in the United States for suppression of

United States for suppression of Arab uprisings in the Holy Land over the partition plan recently adopted by the United Nations General Assembly.

Informed sources at Lake Success said that Jewish Agency officials were also feeling out possibilities of obtaining American aid to restore order in the Holy Land, It was reported that the aid being sought included diplomatic pressure by the State Department on governments of the Arab nations in the Middle East and an embargo on materials that might be used by the Arabs to further the conflict.

N. commission charged with supervising the transfer of authority from the British to the Arabs and Jews.






