Israel Makes New Bid for Peace Talks

An Israeli Foreign Office spokesman said Israeli is prepared to undertake "separate peace talks with each of the Arab countries."

A previous Israeli bid for

peace talks, transmitted through the United Nations mediator, Count Folke Bernadotte, was turned down by the Egyptian government. A source close to the Arab League said the league had also rejected

the invitation.

King Abdullah of TransJordan declared at that time,
however, that possibilities of
peace between the Jews and
Arabs should be considered.
