U. S., Britain Try to Crack **Arab Unity** LAKE SUCCESS, July 9 (U.P.)-The

United States and Great Britain were trying to widen cracks in the

unity of the Arab League tonight in

the hope of winning a belated ex-

tension of the truce in Palestine.

While the U. N. Security Council stood by for the arrival of Count

Folke Bernadotte and a personal account of his Holy Land mediator efforts, the Western Powers behind
